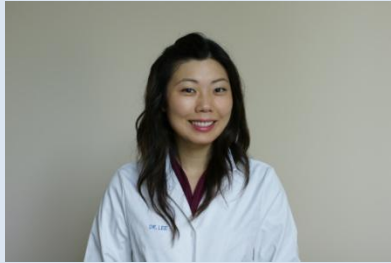

Tongue piercing, what you should know

Your tongue is very important. You need it to eat and taste your food, to talk, to swallow and to protect your throat. Why that tongue piercing is so popular? I read tons of articles by those who perform piercings and by those who have it done. However, none of those articles convinced me that tongue piercing is absolutely 100 % safe. Those who perform that “torture” to people have some kind of “certification” that permits them to do that procedure...seriously, do they know anything about anatomy? Do they know all about the nerves, muscles and blood supply that your tongue is filled with? So if you decided to pierce your tongue, please read the following:

Tongue and lip piercings can cause multiple issues in your mouth.

1. The barbell of the tongue piercing can cause cracks, breaks, and fractures of the teeth, which then would need crowns, fillings or possible extractions. Tongue or lip piercings can cause gum defects (receding gums) that will have to be

fixed by performing gum graft surgery.



2. Major blood vessels connect the tongue with the brain and other areas. Damaging such blood vessels can cause infection which can spread to vital organs of the body, such as the brain, which in severe cases can even kill a person



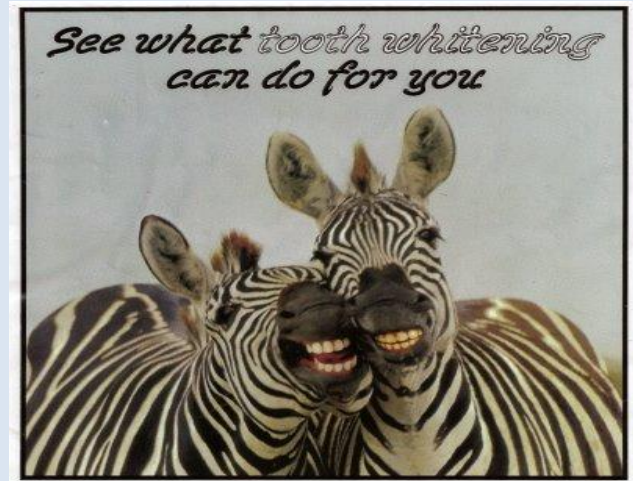
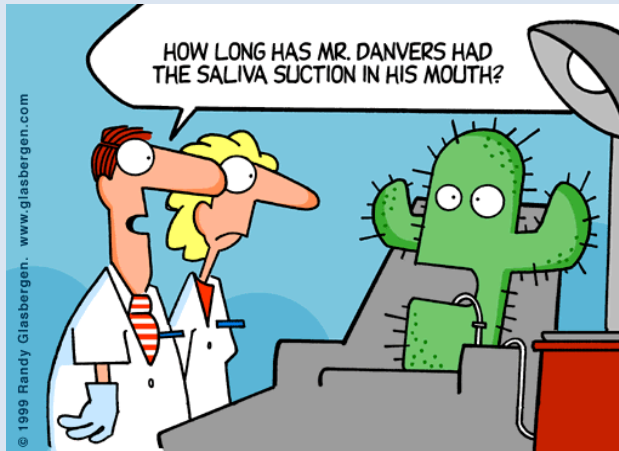
This is infection.
